

GOLD STAR CHILDREN

The death of a parent impacts the life of a child forever. A new hour-long documentary film, "**GOLD STAR CHILDREN: Two Generations Sharing Loss and Healing**" takes an intimate look at American children who've lost a parent to war across two generations.

The families of the fallen can help each other by watching this film together and sharing their thoughts and emotions with others who have also experienced a military loss. It validates the experience, and will help start the long process of grieving. For the rest of the country, **Gold Star Children** explains the experience of losing a parent to war and can build bridges of understanding throughout American communities nationwide.

The film is intended to raise awareness about the struggles faced by our nation's Gold Star children and how all Americans can get involved and help.

Standard Group Screening

Gold Star Children screening would entail:

- 100 DVDs would be provided to share with attendees, local military families and/or community groups. Each DVD jewel case could have a sticker label that would highlight the sponsor for the screening.
- A special Blu-ray disc of the film will be sent to the sponsoring organization for the screening.

For each Standard Group screening, a sponsor would donate \$1000 to Gold Star Children the not-for-profit to cover the costs.

Premiere Screening

Gold Star Children screening would entail:

- 100 DVDs would be provided to share with attendees, local military families and/or community groups. Each DVD jewel case could have a sticker label that would highlight the sponsor for the screening.
- A special Blu-ray disc of the film will be sent to the sponsoring organization for the screening.
- Appearance by the filmmaker Mitty Griffis Mirrer at the screening. Mirrer will introduce the film and facilitate a Q&A discussion after the film.

For each Premiere screening, a sponsor would donate \$2000 to Gold Star Children the not-for-profit to cover the costs. Plus the cost of travel for Ms. Mirrer.

All donations are made to the not-for-profit organization "Gold Star Children" that is responsible for the production and distribution of the film. The mission of the not-for-profit is to touch every family in America with the story of our gold star children.
